Food. Native plants that provide food eaten by a variety of wildlife. Feeders supplement natural food sources.

Water. All animals need water to survive and some need it for bathing or breeding as well.

Cover: Places where animals take shelter from bad weather and hide from predators or hunt for prey.

Places to Raise Young: Resources allowing wildlife to reproduce, protect and nourish their young.

Sustainable Practices: Yards and gardens maintained in natural ways to ensure soil, air, and water stay healthy and clean.

How Wildlife Habitats Help? Wildlife are losing habitats with rapid, large-scale changes to land and water. Habitat gardens help revitalize resources for key wildlife such as bees, butterflies, birds, and amphibians.
